# Scholarship Information For Applicants & Parents

## ELIGIBILITY

Matriculated students in good standing academically at a community college, college, university or trade/technical school and residing at an apartment community in which Michaels Student Living has an ownership interest, or is managing in partnership with a college or university, are eligible to apply (see list of apartment communities provided in a drop-down box on the application form). Students must be on a lease and be a resident in good standing as of September 10, 2022 currently residing at an aforementioned Michaels apartment community to qualify as eligible. Additionally, the applicant cannot graduate on or before March 31, 2023, and must be registered for enrollment for the fall 2022 and spring 2023 semesters.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

The criteria used to select grant recipients includes academic performance, character, financial need, and proficiency or potential proficiency in a chosen field of study. Each of these criteria carries equal weight in determining who will receive grants. Academic performance is determined by evaluating high school or college grade transcripts released to the Michaels Scholarship Program by the student.

All matriculated college or trade/technical school students applying must possess a minimum of a 3.2 grade point average on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent. College students applying for grants who have attained sufficient credits at their institution of higher learning to be considered as a junior, must provide documentation of a declared major. The Michaels Scholarship Program values student efforts in working toward a degree.

Character and proficiency in a chosen field of study will be evaluated through examination of an essay, of approximately 400 words, written by the student and by one required reference. Please inform the selection committee of your chosen field of endeavor. Please **include information regarding co-curricular and community service activities (sports, educational, social, civic, religious, job experiences and/or family responsibilities)** which reflect your interest in the field you have chosen to pursue through your post-secondary studies. We encourage you to elaborate briefly on the length of time of your involvement and describe any projects that reflect your interest in your chosen field of study. In lieu of the essay, a student may submit **a creative alternative**. A creative alternative should only be uploaded if the student is pursuing a degree in a major related to their creative submission. Video presentations should not exceed 3 minutes. You may also upload a file with your portfolio of creative works.

## DETERMINATION OF FINANCIAL NEED

The Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program recognizes that pursuing higher education can be very expensive. Further, the Scholarship Program understands that all students are expected to contribute toward their education costs. How much an individual and their family will be expected to contribute depends on their financial situation. As a result, a student and/or their family must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which yields an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) score. This score is widely accepted and used by colleges and universities across the country as a determination of financial need. The Scholarship Program requires the applicant's 2022 FAFSA EFC score (**see application page**) and reserves the right to request official verification of the EFC score.

## DESCRIPTION OF AWARDS

Each award will represent a scholarship grant provided to the recipient. These grants should not be mistaken in any way for student loans. The exact number of awards and the total amount of money to be awarded in 2022 will be determined during the selection process, in the sole discretion of the Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program.

## PAYMENTS OF GRANTS

All grants are made payable to the colleges or other post-secondary institutions where the recipient will attend during the 2022-23 school year. All recipients must provide the Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program verification of enrollment at an accredited school. It is the intent of the Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program that the full amount of these grants will be applied toward the recipient's direct school expenses. We suggest that the recipient contact the Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program before accepting any scholarship, if there is any doubt about the continuance of other financial aid, especially need-based scholarships. **Michaels Student Living Scholarship Funds may NOT be utilized to pay rent at your MSL Community.**

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE

There are four essential parts of this application, and all must be received in order for the Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program to consider an application.

### **The deadline for completed applications is October 14, 2022.**

- I. The completed Application Form that contains basic information about the applicant, as well as, the applicant's and parent/guardian statement with signatures.
- II. An official grade transcript that shows the courses you have taken and the grades awarded through the spring 2022 semester. These transcripts will allow us to evaluate academic performance. This transcript should be sent via US Mail to: Dr. Bruce W. Johnson, Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program, P.O. Box 740, Washington Crossing, PA 18977. All transcripts must be postmarked on or before October 14, 2022.
- III. The selection committee wants to get to know you on a personal level and gain insight into your character and chosen field of endeavor. In an essay of approximately 400 words, typed on the page provided in the application, identify and describe what you feel are your most positive personal qualities. Also inform the selection committee of your chosen field of endeavor. Please list co-curricular activities (sports, educational, social, civic, religious, job experiences, and/or family responsibilities) which reflect your interest in the field you have chosen to pursue through your post-secondary studies. We encourage you to elaborate briefly on the length of time of your involvement and describe any projects that reflect your interest in your chosen field of study. In lieu of the essay, a student may submit a creative alternative to the essay. **A creative alternative should only be uploaded if the student is pursuing a degree in a major related to their creative submission.** Video presentations should not exceed 3 minutes. You may also upload a file with your portfolio of creative works.

- IV. One completed reference form must be submitted. This reference should come from a person who has first-hand knowledge of your functioning as a student on a regular basis. The Foundation assumes that recommendations from teachers, guidance counselors, principals, deans, and other school administrators are better indicators of a student's future performance in school than personal recommendations. **AS A RESULT, THIS RECOMMENDATION MUST COME FROM ONE OF THE AFOREMENTIONED TYPE INDIVIDUALS. PERSONAL REFERENCES AND REFERENCES FROM RELATIVES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

## NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

The selection committee will meet during the month of November. All applicants will be notified by November 22, 2022 of the outcome status of their application.

## IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES

- October 14, 2022** **FINAL DEADLINE** for all parts of the application for a 2022 Michaels Student Living Scholarship Grant. Mail the grade transcripts to Dr. Bruce W. Johnson, Michaels Student Living Scholarship Program, P.O. Box 740, Washington Crossing, PA 18977.
- November 22, 2022** All applicants notified of the outcome status of their application.
- December 16, 2022** Scholarship checks, made payable to post-secondary institutions, will be sent directly to the post-secondary institution via U.S. mail on behalf of the scholarship recipient to help pay for the student's 2022-23 school year costs.
